- 5.1.1. For Internet Explorer (version 11), simply go to "Tools", then "Internet Options", followed by "Privacy" and "Advanced". In the Advanced settings, you can manage your cookie preferences and block them.
- 5.1.2. In Firefox (version 47), access the "Tools" menu, select "Options", then "Privacy". From there, choose "Use custom settings for history" and uncheck the box that says "Accept cookies from sites" to prevent them from being saved.
- 5.1.3. Chrome (version 54) users can block all cookies by navigating to the "Customize and control" menu, then selecting "Settings". Next, click on "Show advanced settings" and go to "Content settings". Under the "Cookies" section, choose the option that says "Block sites from setting any data".
- 5.1.4. Opera users can block all cookies by going to the main menu and selecting "Settings". From there, click on "Privacy & security" in the sidebar and navigate to the "Cookies" section. Choose an option that suits your preference for handling cookies.
- 5.2. However, it's important to note that blocking all cookies may have a detrimental effect on the usability of our website.
- 5.3. By blocking cookies, you may experience limitations in accessing certain features on our website.

## 6. Deleting cookies

- 6.1. If you wish to remove cookies that are already stored on your computer, there are different methods depending on the browser you are using. Here are the steps for each:
- 6.1.1. In Internet Explorer, version 11, it is necessary to delete the cookie files. You can find detailed instructions on how to do this by visiting http://windows.microsoft.com/engb/internet-explorer/delete-manage-cookies#ie=ie-11.
- 6.1.2. For Firefox users, specifically version 47, you can delete cookies by following these steps: click on "Tools" in the browser menu, then select "Options" and "Privacy". From there, choose "Use custom settings for history" from the dropdown menu, click on "Show Cookies", and finally, click "Remove All Cookies". If you require more guidance, you can

6.1.3. Users of Chrome, version 52, can delete all cookies by accessing the browser's "Customise and control" menu, and then clicking on "Settings". After that, select "Show advanced settings" and navigate to "Clear browsing data". From there, choose "Cookies and other site and plug-in data" before finally clicking "Clear browsing data".
